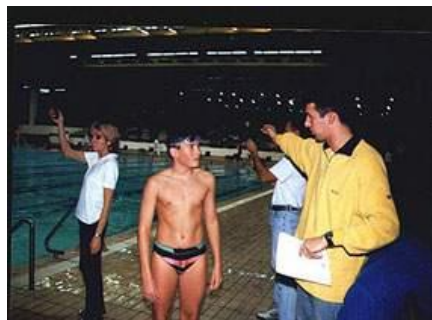

Sono molte le novità in seno alla Rari Nantes, sodalizio impegnato, ormai da anni, nel nuoto con brillanti risultati. In primo luogo va sottolineato che la squadra agonistica, che comprende atleti dai 9 ai 18 anni, ha assunto una connotazione comprensoriale visto che i suoi atleti risiedono, oltre che ad Ascoli, a Castelli di Lama, San Benedetto, Sant'Egidio ed Alba Adriatica.

Ma la novità principale è rappresentata dal nuovo tecnico Sergio Filipovic. Un tecnico di esperienza internazionale con all'attivo parecchi anni di permanenza alla guida della squadra di nuoto della Stella Rossa di Belgrado e della Nazionale della ex Jugoslavia under 15.

La società ascolana aveva iniziato la stagione con istruttrice Barbara Girolami che, però, aveva già fatto presente di non poter garantire un impegno costante a causa dei suoi impegni professionali.

C'è stata poi la possibilità, per i dirigenti ascolani, attraverso amicizie comuni, di mettersi in contatto con il tecnico jugoslavo che, nel giro di pochi giorni, si è trasferito ad Ascoli ed ha iniziato il nuovo lavoro con la squadra.

Filipovic sta seguendo il gruppo di ragazzi da circa 2 mesi e conta di trasmettere loro quelle qualità che gli hanno consentito, da atleta, di ottenere brillanti risultati come il record jugoslavo dei 1500 senior, alcune affermazioni nei campionati balcanici di nuoto e la partecipazione ai campionati del mondo in Cina nel 1993. Ed i primi risultati si sono già visti ai meeting di nuoto "Città di Ascoli".

La Rari Nantes, infatti, ha ottenuto ben 15 medaglie di cui cinque d'oro. In evidenza Alessio Celani, Simona Alfonsi, Melissa Corradi e le atlete della staffetta 4 X 50 stile (Eleonora Iavarone, Katia Porrani e le stesse Melissa Corradi e Simona Alfonsi). E' stata una competizione nella quale gli atleti della Rari Nantes si sono messi particolarmente in evidenza dimostrando di che stoffa sono fatti lasciando dunque ben sperare in una stagione ricca di eventi positivi. "I ragazzi che sto seguendo", dice Sergio Filipovic, "sono davvero promettenti e possono migliorare ancora. Contiamo, nel giro di un paio di anni, di ottenere risultati a livello regionale e nazionale".
